# 2021–2022 BCA Scholarship Program

Blind Citizens Australia, (BCA) is strongly committed to ensuring people who are blind or vision impaired have opportunities to develop skills which equip them to contribute to the social, economic and cultural life of Australian communities. BCA has received funding through the Commonwealth's <u>Information, Linkages and Capacity-building program</u> and the <u>Jeffrey Blyth Foundation</u> to award educational scholarships to BCA members.

# Objectives

The scholarships program has two key objectives:

- To increase the opportunities available to people who are blind or vision impaired to participate in tertiary/further education, by offering financial assistance.
- To raise the awareness of main-stream education providers of the valuable contributions and unique perspectives people who are blind or vision impaired make to education and training.

## **Scholarship Value**

For 2020-2022, BCA is offering 5 scholarships supported by the of up to \$5,000 each semester for the three semesters: Semester 2, 2021, Semesters 1 and 2, 2022. Each semester will have a separate application and awarding process, scholarship recipients will be funded for one semester only.

# Administration

BCA will:

- manage the administration of the program,
- engage educational organizations to promote the funding opportunities,
- support scholarship recipients' and their schools with accessibility and inclusion expertise, advice and/or resources, and
- explore further options for growing relationships with these educational institutions too.

## **Application Process**

- Application forms will be created, managed and received by BCA
- Applications open May 17 June 30, 2021 (round 1), November 22, 2021 February 4, 2022 (round 2), May 17 – June 30, 2022 (round 3)
- Student must include proof of current enrolment into a course with a recognizable qualification outcome, which will be confirmed as part of the application assessment process.
- Student may request funds for specific educational expenses, which may extend beyond only course fees to include adaptive technology, course materials or other expenses directly relevant to support their ability to be successful in their course of study. A detailed expense sheet will be part of the application form.

### **Assessment Process**

- Applications will be assessed by a selection panel that will include BCA representative, JBF representative and an academic who is blind or vision impaired.
- BCA will manage the assessment of the scholarship applications based upon the following criteria:
  - Australian resident

- BCA full member
- Seeking a recognizable qualification outcome
- Course of study is a logical trajectory for the student's skills, interests and goals

### **Funds disbursement**

The scholarships will be paid to the student directly in two instalments:

- 60% will be paid once confirmation of course enrolment is received.
- 40% will be paid upon student's submission of evidence of completed units to BCA.

## **Expectations of Recipients**

- Recipients will participate in at least two activities for the scholarships program. These activities may include, but are not limited to;
- Interviews on BCA's weekly radio program and podcast, "New Horizons"
- Writing articles for BCA's Magazine, Blind Citizens News
- Speaking at BCA virtual and face to face events
- Working with one of BCA's or JBF's committees or representative groups, in an area that relates to the focus of their studies.
